President Short lead the Pledge of Allegiance and read the district safety protocol, Mission and Vision statement

Special Presentation

Principal Hudson and Jennifer Lopez presented an overview of the Greywolf Family Engagement goals and events

Superintendent Neal read the Education Support Professionals Week Proclamation from Governor Inslee and expressed gratitude to all Sequim School district classified staff.

Superintendent Neal has suspended all FLASH curriculum for the 2017-2018 school year. The board approved the curriculum in 2010. Some items were updated to the curriculum that Neal said were not age appropriate. The state requires that HIV/Aids, CPR/AED, Prevention of sexually transmitted disease and mental health and suicide prevention be taught. Now until the end of the school year, the school and parents will meet and modify and/or develop new curriculum. In 2010, FLASH was the only approved curriculum approved by OSPI and it was offered for free. Other districts who use FLASH did not go through an additional adoption process when the updates were made. Superintendent Neal thanked Jason Peterson who originally brought his concerns to the board about the curriculum and has collaboratively, and positively worked with school and district personnel to resolve this issue.

Karen Hogan spoke in favor of tasking law enforcement, not volunteers to protect the schools; Jack Singleton offered a \$1000 check to begin a security fund as Sequim PD does not have the resources to protect our schools and has a group of people who are willing to volunteer; Roger Neiainger would like to know what the purpose of having cell phones at school is; Jerry Mote believes the school is doing a poor job as far as security is concerned and would like a team of people who know what their doing to come up with a plan; Larry Jeffryes suggested reviewing and practicing the current safety plans we have in place; Sheena Younger thanked the district for their support of the recent event The Beginning held and would like continue educating students and the public about what consent is; Lori Pritchard thanked the school board for hearing us and taking action to suspend the FLASH curriculum; Tiffani Mote spoke in regards to security and creating a team of trained people to handle security; Jason Peterson thanked the board, Superintendent and school personnel for their efforts in regards to suspending the FLASH curriculum; Anthony Orlando said the school shootings are not a gun problem and urged the community, and parents to be involved to take the community back. Public comments ended at 7:03pm.

Board Communication and Other Items

Director Gibson thanked the public for attending and sharing their thoughts. The board members are parents and board members. Thank you Sheena and The Beginning for the informative event regarding sexual abuse.

Director Henrikson thanked Jodi Olson who has recently taken over the HiCap coordinator position and is doing a wonderful job with STEM and the wax museum project.

Director Stoffer has had a conversation with the County Auditor in regards to placing ballot boxes on school campuses. There are security concerns. The Beginning event was outstanding. Many board members attended the ECO council dinner. The growth and achievement night recoginzed roughly 30 students. A WSSDA update was presented and from 3/15-4/30 proposals can be submitted by the board.

Vice President Kuh thanked everyone who came to speak and all staff for taking care of the FLASH Curriculum issue. He would like to formally suggest that we move board meetings to the transit center. Kuh wants action and to be deliberate in ragards to addressing school shootings. He thanked Larry Jeffryes for facilitating Facebook diaglogue and would like to look at all options for keeping our students safe and agrees this is a community issue.

President Short attended Strategic Planning and thanked others who are actively involved in these important meetings. Please let Trayce know if you will be attending graduation on June 8th.

Damon Little reported that Greywolf will be hosting a family movie night on 3/16 from 6-7:45pm. The movie will be The Jungle Book and be viewed in the gym. They are looking foward to their book fiar coming up in a couple weeks on 3/19.

Tea' Gauthun reported on March 26 grade 6-8 have the SBA in ELA and math. 64% of their student body qualified for the honor roll last week, they are very proud of them and all their hard work. They had an amazing growth and achievement night as well last week. A special thanks to Sequim Education Foundation for their support of this special event. Superintendent Report

Thanks to Hanna Smith for the organization of the Community Truancy board. Four students were seen today. This recent shooting has a different vibe than past event. After Columbine Washington State become a leader of crisis planning. Two years ago Greywolf had an Active Shooter Drill on their campus involving many state and local agencies. Peninsulua college had one on their campus last year. Another training will take place at a Sequim school in 2019. Superintendent Neal has been in communication with secondary principals in regards to the upcoming Walk out. This is an opprotunity for conversation with our students.
